The Indianapolis Colts aren't the best team in the NFL, despite their 8-0 record.

They have one of the best offenses, if not the best offense in the league, but they don't have the defense to be the best team in the league. The Colts are last in the league against the run, giving up 165.4 rushing yards per game. They also give up 21.6 points per game, 20th in the NFL.
