Senior Robbie Goins was released from the hospital after being involved in a car accident last week.

He was hospitalized on Nov. 6 after his SUV crashed into the side of Trinity Worship Center on S. Church Street in Burlington. He was transported to Alamance Regional Medical Center where he was treated for lacerations and contusions. Goins was released from the hospital on Tuesday night, spending over a week in the hospital.

The police believed that the accident was caused by possible narcotics, excessive driving and a possible medical condition, but the incident is still under investigation.

"Any action that may be taken as a result of anything that happened in still pending feedback from the accident," football coach Pete Lembo said. "All his previous experiences and dealings in this community have been very positive."

Goins is a defensive end on the Elon football team and the team captain. He was held out of the team's trip to North Carolina A&T this weekend because of his stay in the hospital.

Up until this point Goins has appeared in nine of the team's 10 games and recorded 27 tackles, two for a loss, and half a sack.

"It's not the way I'd like to see any senior finish his career," Lembo said. "These are the trials that people go through in their lives and I'm sure he will get through this and move on."

Goins' will not be participating in the team's game this weekend against The Citadel. His last game as a Phoenix will be from the bench.
