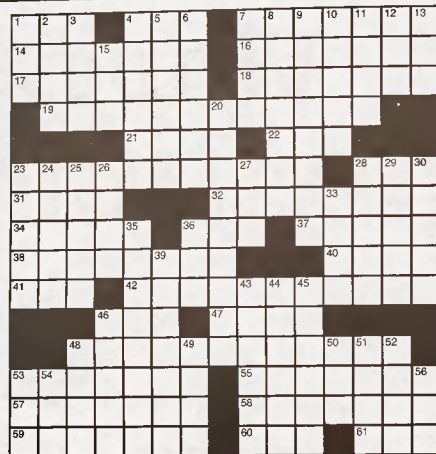

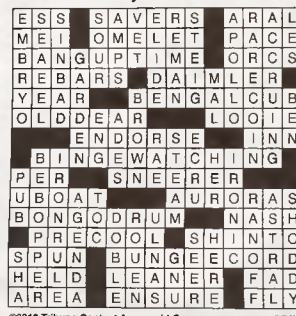

THIS WEEK IN HISTORY - WOMEN'S LACROSSE BEGINS FIRST INTERCOLLEGIATE COMPETITION

Elon University women's lacrosse team played their first game of the 2018 season last Sunday, Feb. 11. This week four years ago, women's lacrosse began its first season of intercollegiate competition.

In 2014, the team's roster numbered just 25, and 21 of them were freshmen. This season, the team has grown to 43 members.

Dave Blank, director of athletics, said the decision to add women's lacrosse was made due to the sport's increasing popularity.

"Women's lacrosse is growing at an incredible pace, and we are excited to add this opportunity for Elon stu-

dent-athletes," Blank said.

Josh Hexter, Duke University women's lacrosse associate head coach, was hired to lead the team and Virginia Crotty, a former Duke lacrosse player was hired as the program's first assistant coach.

Crotty told The Pendulum she thought Elon had the potential to become a strong lacrosse school like her alma mater.

"We want to set the bar really high," Crotty said. "For the team, I want a conference championship."

In 2017, the women's lacrosse team qualified for the NCAA tournament for the first time, but was eliminated in the first round.
