Though stepping down the dean of the School Communications, Paul Parsons has left a firm stamp on Elon's history since being named dean this week in

Parsons formerly spear-headed the Miller School of Journalism and Mass Communications at Kansas State University. He origi-nally joined the faculty at Kansas State in 1985, serving as the associate director from 1989 to 1997, then becoming

the head of the Miller School. Lambert had high hopes for Parsons' tenure as dean.

"I am very pleased with the selection of a new dean,"
