MESSAGE FROM JIM BUIE

The analogy of the main cog in a very complex machine is significantly characteristic of the Student Government Association of Elon College for the year 1962-63. I can truthfully expound that this year's Student Government Association has been characterized by cooperativeness, mutual and congenial relations with the faculty and administration, dynamic and inquisitive mental processes by many students in order to aid Student Government, a sense of responsibility and a desire for communication with the Student Government leaders in order to understand Student Government problems.

For the past three years the Student Government has grown by leaps and bounds; but this year's Student Government appears as a giant in comparison to all other years. More students have participated in Student Government Affairs than ever before. I attribute the multiplying participation of our students to my administration's "Open Door Policy." This year almost every project we have initiated has been in a sense held up before a mirror through the medium of The Campus Crier so that the student body, faculty and administration were completely informed at all times. By keeping all of our functions before the eyes of everyone connected with Elon College each individual has had a thorough understanding of this years goals. Because they have had an understanding, each person has been very cooperative when he or she was called upon to aid our organization in almost any possible way.

I definitely feel that this year we have had fewer problems than ever before because of the smooth functioning of this year's Student Government Association. When we had a problem the best solution was sought after until found. A good example is as follows: Many students complained about our exam schedules claiming that they were too short for a student to do his best work or all of his exams. I appointed a committee of ten students to investigate the matter and make any recommendations it deemed advisable. After the committee's investigation it submitted its recommendations to the Student Affairs Committee (A joint faculty and student committee) which, in
