


fore, I propose to bring the diversion to him.

-----If you could not answer the questions on a test and it would be easy to look on you neighbor's paper with little chance of being caught, would you cheat?


-----If you knew that you had to make a good grade on an exam to pass a course and a classmate offered to sell you a stolen exam, would you buy it?
