

Beale and I line up these trips for the students. If they want to take advantage of them, that is fine with us. If they don't want to take advantage of them, that too is fine with us.



One of the most recent committees to be appointed by Dr. Danieley; President of Elon College, is the Committee on Improvement of Instruction. The long-range plan of the committee is to improve testing, grading and instruction as well as to better student - faculty relationship.

Last year under the leadership of this committee each faculty member evaluated the courses he was teaching, as well as to how well it accomplished its aims and how it could be improved. As a result of this study certain suggestions as to good practices in instruction were included in this year's faculty handbook.

The committee members felt that a representation from the student body would be quite practical in aiding them in their work. (One of the main objectives of this committee is that the faculty evaluate the students, as well as the students evaluate the teaching methods of the professors.) As a result four students were asked to make suggestions on improvements that could be made in testing and grading.
