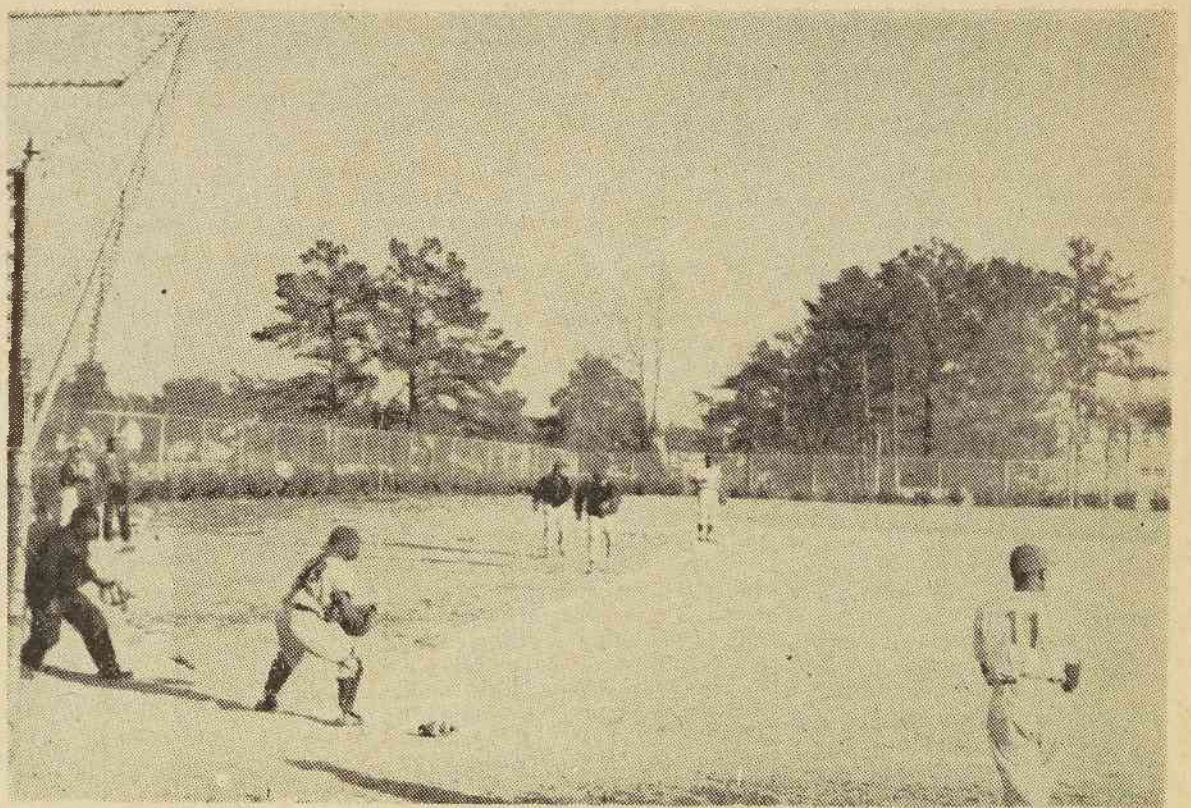

ington, Luther Whitted, Roscoe Dobbins—mile relay.

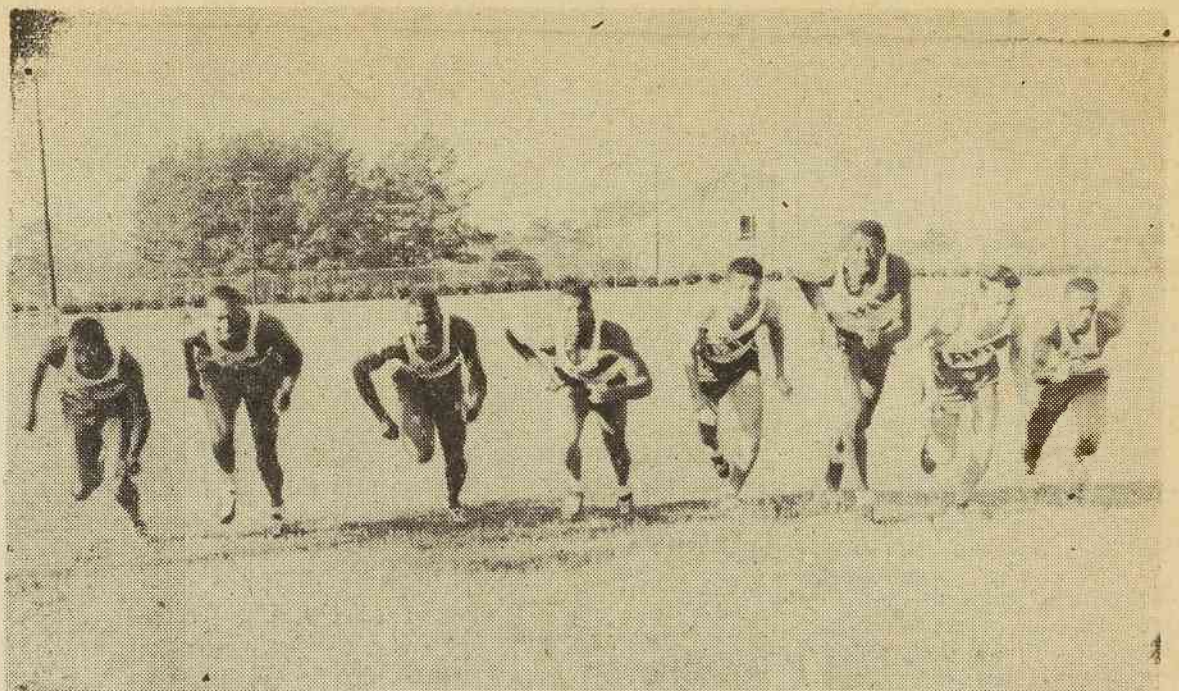
