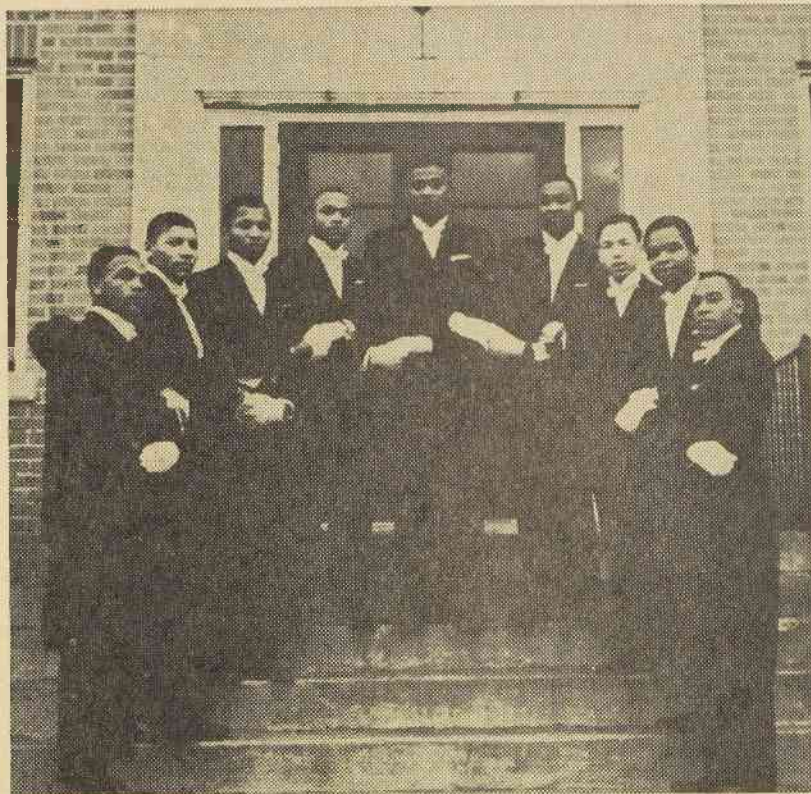

## Do Omega Men of Delta Gamma Have Large "G" Factors

Spearman, an English psychologist and a contemporary of Thorndike, advanced a two-factor theory based on a general mental factor which is designated as "g" and specific factors designated as "s." Spearman's "g" factor refers to a person who is good in a wide variety of activities. His "s" factor explains the special capacities a person may have which are in excess or above the general capacity or general factor. For example a person may be very good in one particular thing and very poor in many others. This is accounted for by specific factors. However, when one is very good in a wide variety of activities it is correct to conclude that one has a large "g" factor. Therefore, if we take Spearman's theory into consideration and consider the many achievements made by Omega Men in a wide variety of activities, it would be safe to conclude that many of the men of Delta Gamma Chapter of Omega

Psi Phi Fraternity possess large "g" factors.

In view of the previous statement I believe it would be proper to give some statistics which will serve to support the statement. However, I should like to be very general in the presentation of the statistics since I prefer not to mention the names of specific individuals.

The fact that Omega men possess large "g" factors may be demonstrated by examining the scores made on the National Teachers Examination which was taken by the senior of F.S.T.C. The highest score among the students from F. S. T. C. was made by an Omega, the third highest score was made by an Omega, and there were three Omega men who ranked in the top ten. These three Omegas excel in such activities as track, football, and government. It should also be noted that all three are better than average as far as academic performance is concerned.

As further evidence of Omega men having large "g" factors, Governor Sanford appointed three Omega men to the State Student Committee for a Better North Carolina in 1961. These same men are outstanding in various other activities on campus and are better than average academically. Omega men of Delta Gamma have also excelled in Dramatics. They have starred in such productions as: "The Boy Friend," "The Day's Mischief," "Fumed Oak," and "Pygmalion." Finally, Omega men hold such offices as class presidents, judgeship, organization presidents, and they also rank better than average academically. In view of the many achievements of the Omega men of Delta Gamma, I feel that it would be less than an exaggeration to say that the psychologist, Spearman, might have been thinking of men of high achievement such as those of Delta Gamma when he was in the process of formulating his two-factor theory.

## YMCA and YWCA

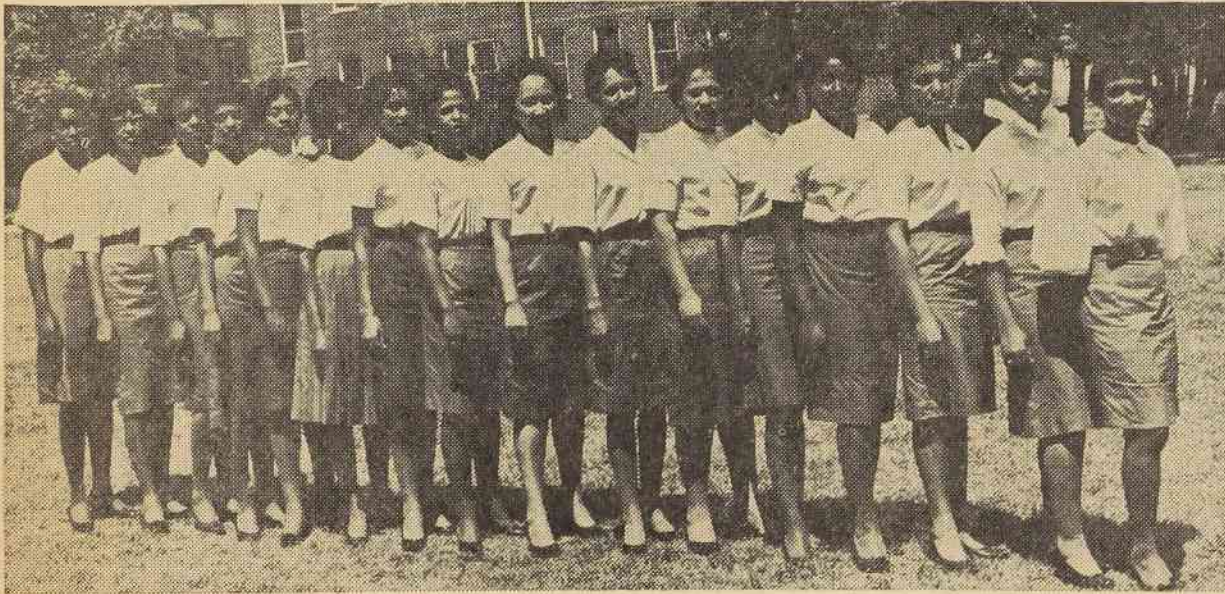
Recently, the YMCA and the YWCA had a drive to raise money for the clubs by selling candy on campus. It was very successful.
