NEWS FROM THE DIVISION OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMICS

Dr. Grace C. Black, Acting Chairman of the Division of Business and Economics, was named by the State Department of Public Instruction to serve on the evaluation team for the Teacher Education program at North Carolina Central University. This evaluation was held in Durham during the period October 2 - 3.

Dr. Black and Mrs. Beulah G. Monroe, Acting Chairman of the Department of Business Education, attended a Teacher Education Conference in Wilmington on October 9 - 10. The subject of the conference was "Coordination and Cooperation in

Occupational Education." Representatives from the State Department of Public Instruction along with teacher educators throughout the state were in attendance.

Moses Walker, Assistant Professor in Business Administration, represented the Division at the recent meeting of the North Carolina Business Resource Seminar in Raleigh. Also attending were two students in the Department—Misses Geraldine Smith and Patricia Bullock. DIVISION OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMICS

The Division of Business and Economics consists of the Department of Business Administration and Economics and the Department of Business Education. The Division has as its purpose to provide a viable, resilient education for those who will ultimately serve in responsible administrative and professional positions in the business world at large. Students are prepared for occupations in the areas of accounting, teaching, office administration, marketing, finance, insurance, advertising, real estate, management, computer science, banking, and school administration.

The Business Education curriculum prepared for certified teaching in the secondary schools as well as for teaching in the community colleges and other institutions in which business subjects are taught. For Basic Business, shorthand is not required; and greater emphasis is placed upon business, economics, and accounting that in Comprehensive Business. A major in Comprehensive Business Education must enroll in courses in the secretarial skills as well as courses in the basic business subjects.

The Division of Business and Economics also offers two-year associate degree programs in Business Administration and Secretarial Science.

Students enrolling in Business Administration may secure the Bachelor of Science degree by taking one of the two alternative curricula: Option 1: General Business with Concentration from the
