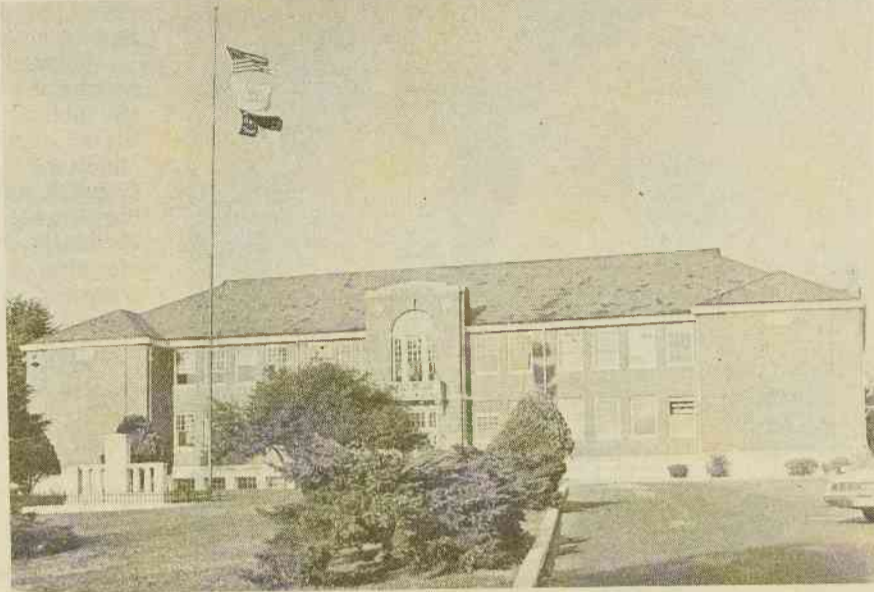

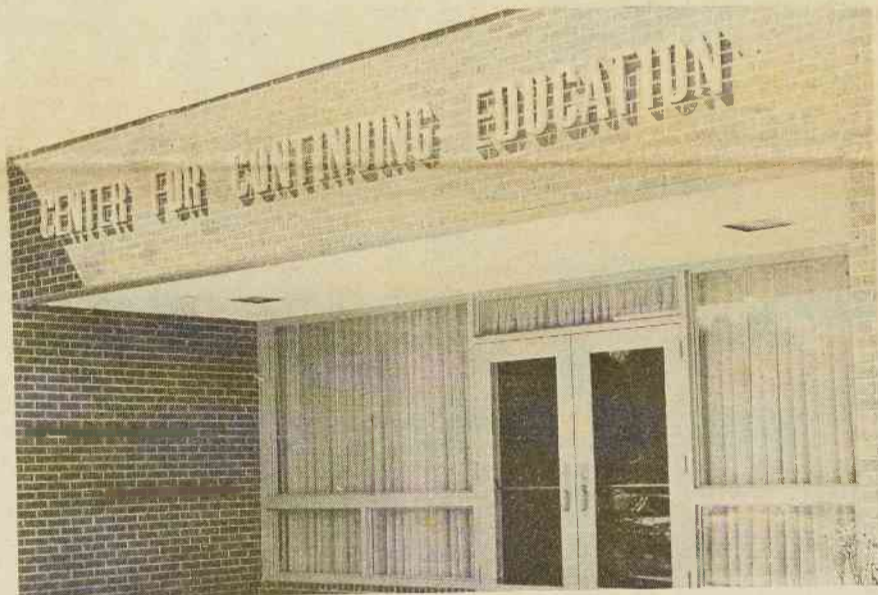
SMITH BUILDING

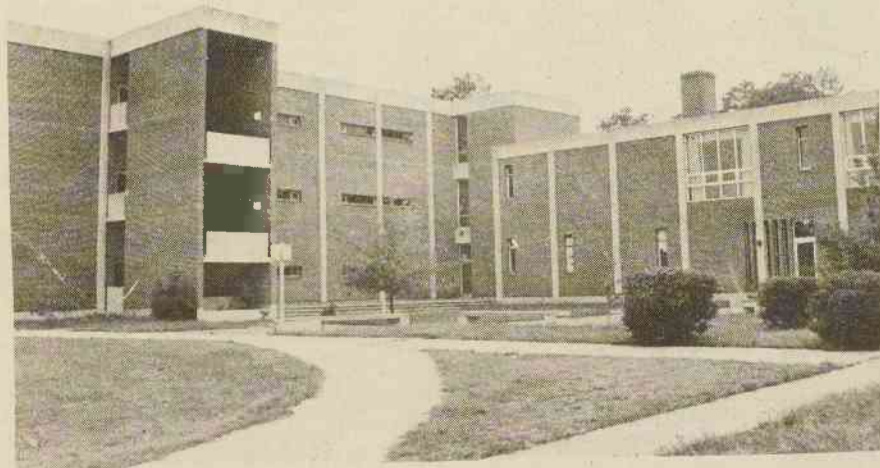

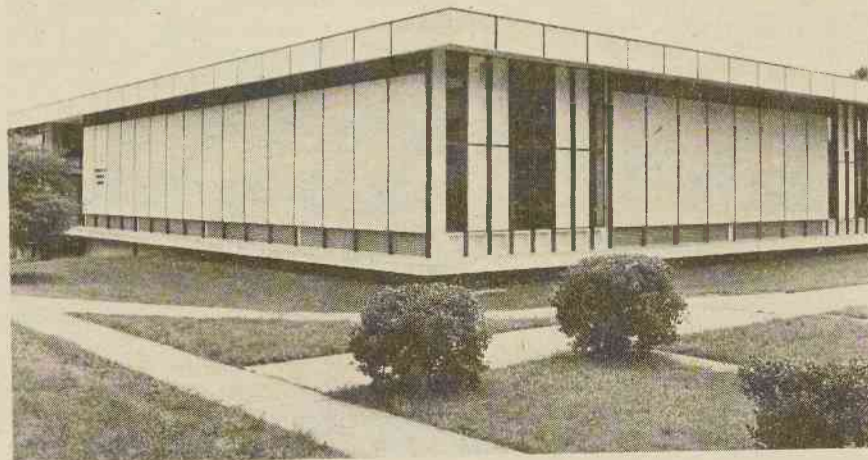
BUTLER BUILDING
