## FSU Students Boycott Classes To Protest Homecoming Theme

FSU students boycotted classes, marched and chanted "We're Comin' Out," and finally stormed the Administration Building on October 27. 1980 in effort to relate to Chancellor Lyons and FSU family members their displeasure concerning the newly adopted Homecoming Theme "A Prideful Past; A Progressive Future." Students alleged that they had submitted the theme "We're Comin' Out" as their choice and that it had been adopted only to have it changed because someone in the administration said that the theme was too vague.

No one appeared to know how the mix-up occurred. Chancellor Lyons stated that he was unaware that any changes had been made.
