Mrs. Council Leaves WCC

Mrs. Mildred Council, director of the Learning Resource Center, is leaving WCC at the end of spring after four years of faithful service. Included in her plans are working in the library of the Science Department at Ap-

palachian State University.

Mrs. Council's contributions to WCC are numerous and quite impressive. She has built up a collection of books and media to support new approaches in education the college plans to implement. She was responsible for obtaining a federal grant to reclassify the library at WCC to the Library of Congress Classification.

Mrs. Council also organized and is presently sponsor of Upsilon Chi, the local chapter of Phi Theta Kappa, the national honor fraternity in American junior colleges. Upsilon Chi was chartered at WCC January 26, 1970, and initiated March 1, 1970, with five charter members.

As for the future, Mrs. Council hopes that the budget will allow for progress to be made in purchase of books, media, adequate personnel, and space to operate efficiently. She says that 5,491 books have been purchased and processed since July 1, 1970, and hopes to reach the goal of 20,000 by July 1, 1971.

Mrs. Council has gained national recognition as a librarian and is a member of several professional organizations including Delta Kappa Gamma, an honorary society of Key women teachers.
