Membership, now standing at 43 alumni, consists of three types:


Membership: open to any former student of WCC who has completed a minimum of 48 quarter hours in a curriculum program and who has left the college of his/her own accord.

Continuing Education.

The committee surveyed local businesses which hire graduates from WCC.

The surveys will be used to determine needed changes in programs.

The committee will look at all 19 programs offered at WCC.

The committee, which the President appointed, has the responsibilities of facilitating, monitoring, and validating the reviews of the programs they are being achieved.
