Jim Crumpler was accepted as a new member of Circle K.

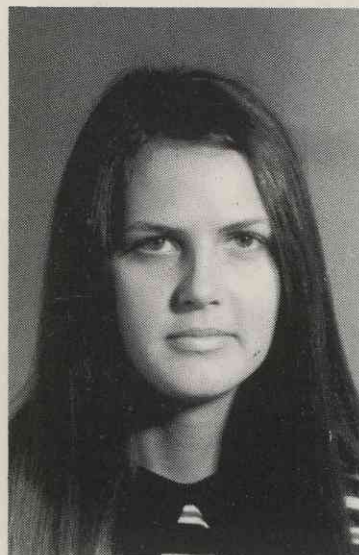

The PBL is conducting another membership drive. Anyone interested in joining is asked to contact Sammy Stone, Mrs. Tugman, or Mrs. Hayes.

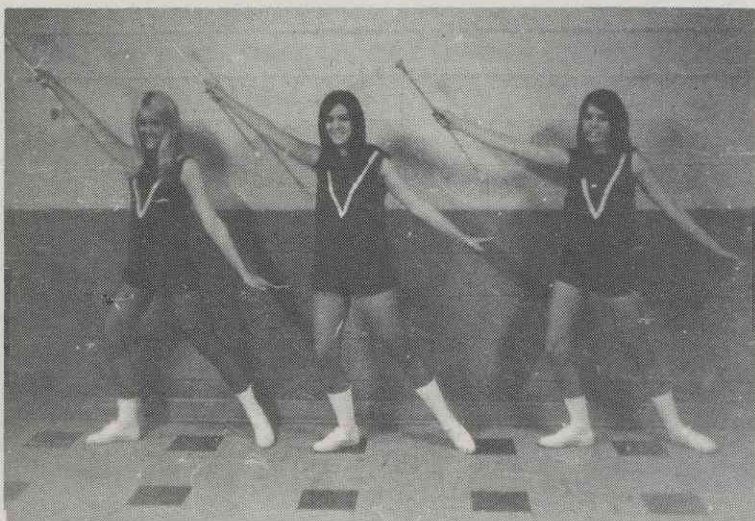
