Scholarships For Children Of Disabled Veterans

Offered By - North Carolina Division of Veterans Affairs.

Field of Specialization-None specified. Scholarships a r e valid in state institutions of higher education and technical institutes. Cash payment provided for use in private colleges within the state.

Value - Provide free tuition, fees and a reasonable room and board allowance in state institutions of higher education and technical institutes. Four years maximum. Certain categories provide free tuition and fees only. Cash payments in private colleges within the state range from \$342 to \$930 per ninemonth academic year.

Eligibility - Children of certain veterans who died or are 100 per cent disabled as a result of service in WWI, WWII, Korea, Vietnam; or children of peacetime veterans whose death or 100 per cent service-connected disability was incurred (1) as a direct result of armed conflict (2) while engaged in extra-hazardous service; or (3) children of certain veterans who were listed in a POW-MIA

status for more than 90 days. The veteran must have been a legal resident of North Carolina at the time of entry into service, or, with certain exceptions, the child must have been born in North Carolina and continuously resided there.

A child is eligible as described above if the parent was a veteran of WWI, WWII, Korea, Vietnam, or a peacetime veteran whose disability was incurred as a direct result of armed conflict or (2) while engaged in extra-hazardous service. The veteran must have or at the time of death must have had a 30 per cent or more but less than 100 per cent service-connected disability or a statutory award for arrested tuberculo-

Also eligible is the child of a veteran rated and receiving or at the time of death receiving 100 per cent non-serviceconnected disability benefits.
