Phi Theta Kappa is an academic organization that serves to recognize and encourage scholarship among junior and community college students. To be eligible for membership at WCC, one must:

- be enrolled at Wilkes Community College.
- have accumulated 24 credit hours and maintain at least 12 credit hours per quarter.
- have a GPA of not less than 3.5 and be in good standing.
- have established academic excellence as judged by the faculty.
- be of good moral character and possess recognized qualities of citizenship.

A Phi Theta Kappa member must also maintain a GPA of 3.4 after acceptance to the organization.
