## GRUEN VON BEHREN IS COMING TO WCC OCTOBER 15, 2007

Gruen was 13 when he tried spit tobacco (dip) on a camping trip with friends. Unfortunately, it wasn't a one-time deal. He ended up with a powerful addiction that changed his life forever. Just four years later, at the age of 17, he was diagnosed with oral cancer. To fight it, he's been forced to endure 35 painful surgeries, including one radical surgery that removed half of his neck muscles and much of his tongue.

"If I had known then what I know now, I never would have put a dip in my mouth. Spit tobacco seemed harmless, but it has ruined my life," says Gruen Von Behrens.

Now 29, he travels the country to show the world the reality of spit tobacco. Gruen will be on the Wilkes Community College Campus
