The game was completely lacking in everything that even remotely resembled a baseball game between two representative college teams. It has been said, and truly said, that every ball player has his "off days," but somehow all of our men had their "off day" last Friday. Worth began the pitching for our boys, but because of wildness, he was replaced by Morris in the second inning. Morris twirled for four or five innings, and then Finch went into the box and somewhat checked the heavy hitting. All three of these men did not allow less than fifteen hits. These fifteen hits coupled with several costly errors on the part of our boys were the cause of the Baptists making seventeen runs. Captain Short again led the batting for our team, getting two hits out of four times to the bat. Futrell, Garner and Royal got one hit each. This was expected to be one of the best and hardest fought games of the season on our home grounds, but to the disgust of the many spectators who came from Greensboro, High Point and Winston-Salem to see the contest it proved to be one of the worst exhibitions of baseball that has ever been pulled off at Guilford College.

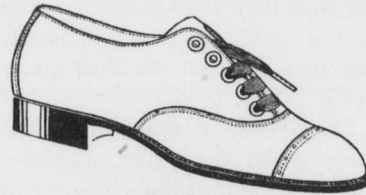
