The fact that men today are fearful of the character of the outcome of the present great upheaval, and that men, not eclesiastical, state that Christianity must be the determining factor in the outcome are significant.

Professor Anscombe continued the service by taking as his text, "For ye were bought with a price, therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit which are God's." We are God's because we are created by Him and all gifts and powers come from Him. We are God's because He gave His life to redeem ours. As our life comes from Him, we should dedicate our lives to Him for service. This is a personal question which each of us must answer for himself.
