Nationally Known Figures Visit
Milners and Address Various
Student Organizations.

REPRESENT MANY FIELDS

President, Engineer, Educators, Dean,
Author and Minister Included In
List of Dignitaries on Campus.

Important men ranging from a famous electrical engineer through a head master emeritus to a mastodon excavator have visited Guilford's campus during the last few days.

Heading the list is Ohio born Charles Edward Skinner, former manager of research and assistant director of engineering at the Westinghouse Electric and Manufacturing Company. Back visiting Guilford after a number of year's absence, Mr. Skinner spoke in chapel Wednesday, April 12 on the "Human Side of Scientists." Informally drawing from personal experience, he rambled through a forty-five minute backward glance at some of his great contemporaries. Mr. Skinner is a relative of Mrs. Milner and was a house guest of President and Mrs. Milner during his visit at Guilford.

Dr. Robbins Wolcott Barstow, president of Hartford Theological Seminary Foundation and member of the executive committee of American Association of Theological Schools, spoke at the New Garden coting April 16. He also addressed Guilford students during chapel April 17. Clergyman and author Barstow and Mrs. Barstow

were house guests of the Milner's during their weekend visit.

L. (for Lester) Ralston Thomas, educator, head master of Moses Brown School, Providence, R. I., member of the Progressive Educational Association, was house guest of President and Mrs. Milner April 18. He did not speak on campus.

William Eves, vice-president and dean of boys at George School, Philadelphia, Pa., and his wife spent April 21 and 22 on campus visiting former students. John Harvey Furbay, lecturer, radio broadcaster, and author, unrec'd motion pictures on Liberia and recordings of native music for two hours the evening of April 30 in the Meeting House. He served as acting president of the college of West Africa, Mon-

rovia, Liberia from 1935 to 1938. He once directed mastodon excavation for Taylor University, still is a contributing editor for the *Modern Psychologist*.
