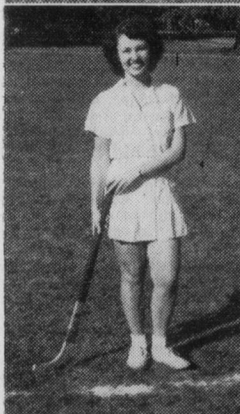

IRC Club Is Host to State Convention; Problems Are Discussed

to discuss the points brought out in both groups.

There was no attempt to arrive at a definite viewpoint in these discussions, but only to stimulate interest and thought in the subjects discussed.

From 7 to 8, a dinner was served for the delegates in the New Garden Meetinghouse by members of the Meeting.

Mr. McNeill Smith, the speaker for the evening, pointed out the possibility and value of a world federation and contrasted it with the present U. N. organization. It was his opinion that World Government was the best alternative so far presented in contrast to the destruction of our culture eventuated by another war.

The following Sunday afternoon a business meeting was held, at which a constitution was ratified and officers were elected.

The purpose of the constitution is stated as follows:

"We, as student organizations, concerned with the promotion of interest in international relations, desire to seek within the State of North Carolina closer cooperation between said clubs, and to promote and perpetuate this closer cooperation through interchange of ideas and experiences on a state, regional, and national basis."

The following officers were elected: Howard Davis, of Guilford College, as state president; and Joe Hester, of Western Carolina Teachers College which will act as host to the state convention next year, as state vice-president.

There was a marked degree of enthusiasm and interest present. The prospects for the state organization are propitious.
