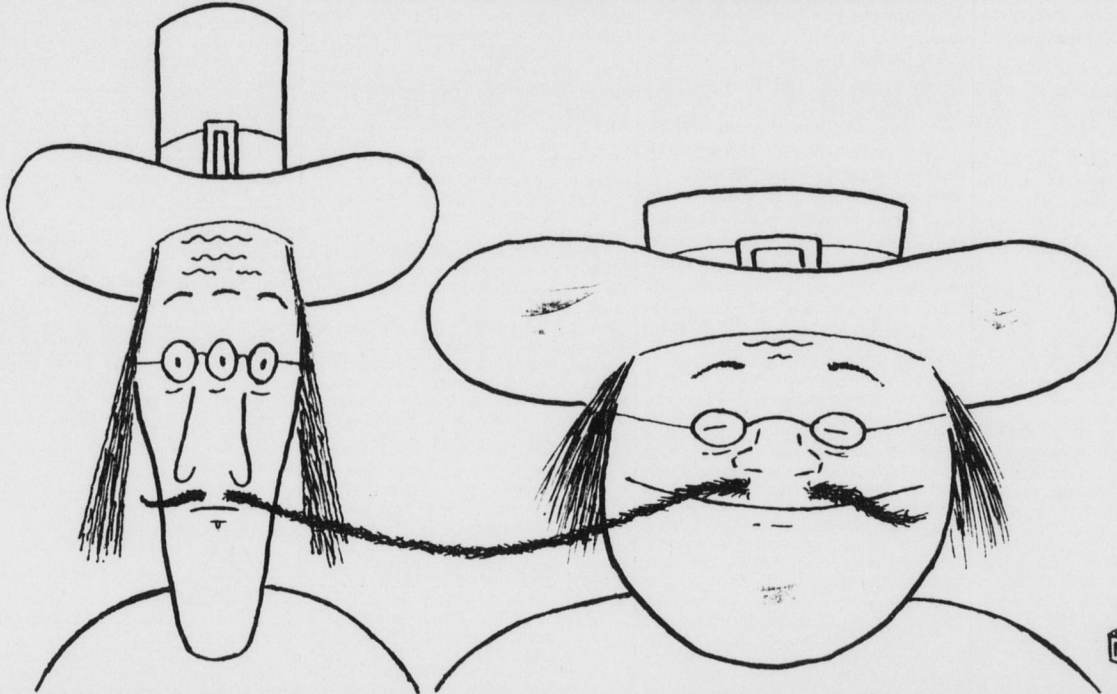

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First Western Electric Scholarship Awarded

The Western Electric Company has recently announced that Fred Elmo Thompson, a sophomore at Guilford College, has received one of the company's scholarships being given through Western Electric's newly established Scholarship Program.

The program consists of one hundred and twenty five scholarships to be offered during 1956 for the 1956-57 academic year. The program provides for approximately one hundred scholarships for engineering students and twenty-five for science, business administration and liberal arts students. Each scholarship will pay up to \$800 a year to cover the cost of tuition, fees and books. An additional cost-of-education grant of approximately three-quarters of the amount of the scholarship

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
