Homecoming Court

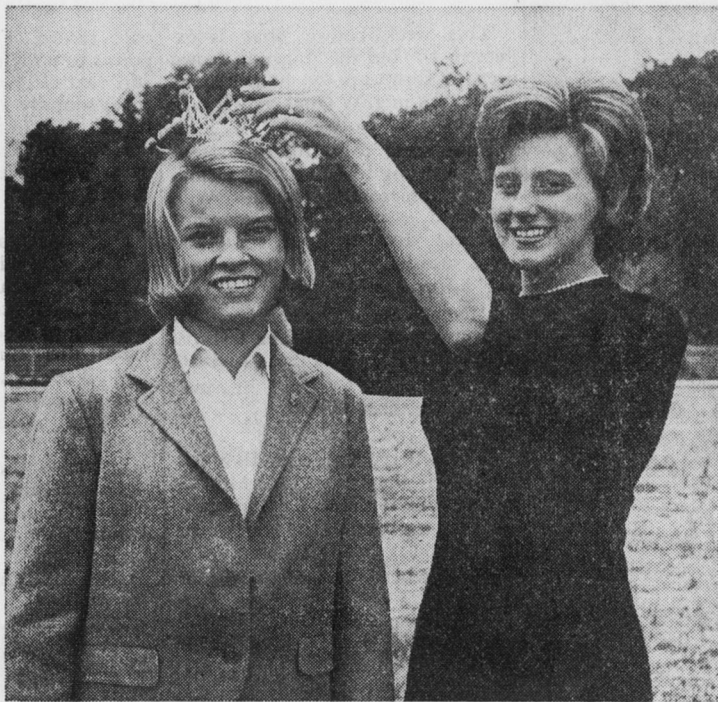
Dottie Alley Crowned By Carolyn Milks

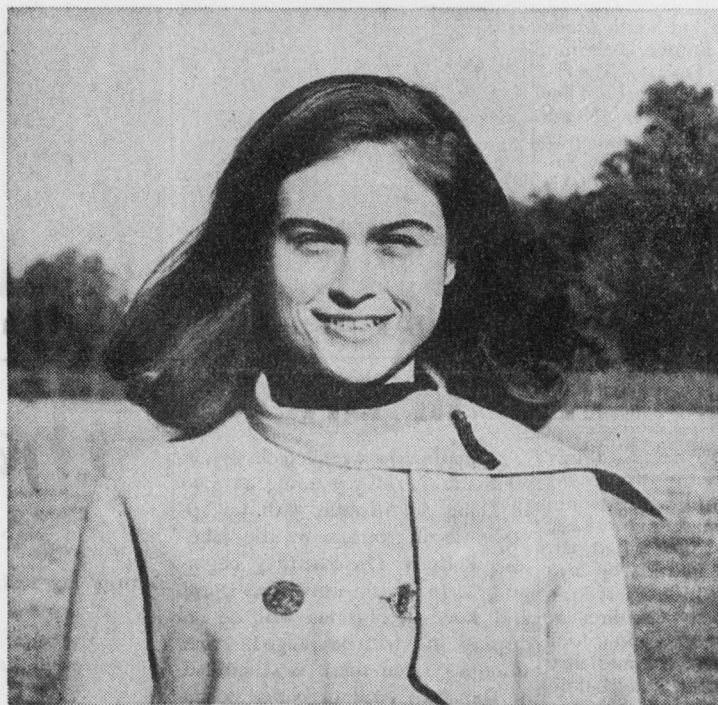
Maid of Honor Donna Newman

Nancy Merritt

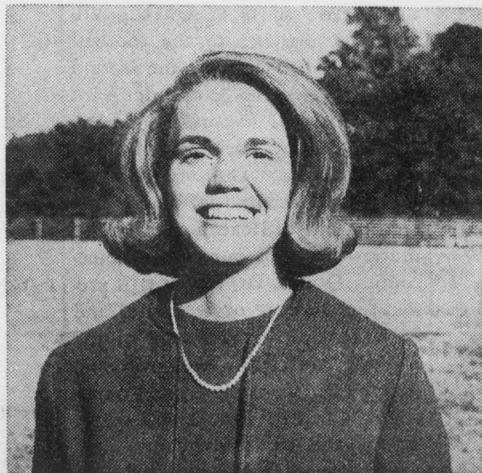
