Saturday, May 5, 1979

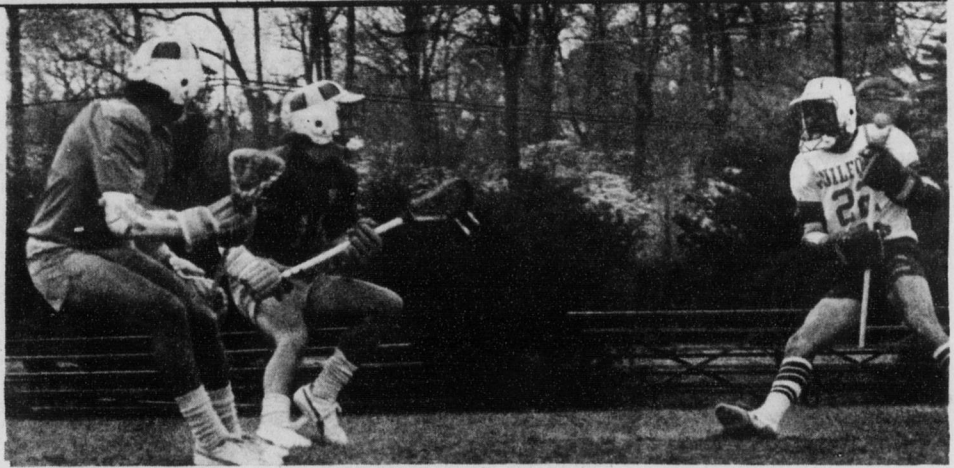
9:00 a.m. Coffee, Campus Lawn For faculty, seniors and parents of seniors.

The team was invited by the Dilworth Community of Charlotte to participate in the Anheuser Busch Natural Light

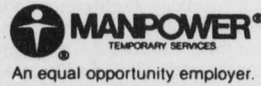
