fund: hence the Quest Campaign.

This is the third year of the Quest Campaign. The target figure is \$10,100,000. This money channeled in several directions. Some, a total of \$1,000,000, will create student scholarships. About \$1,350,000 will go to faculty support, research developments, and laboratory resources.

A substantial improvement will be made to the The cost: library. \$4,900,000. New additions will include eight twostory art exhibition galleries, illuminated by two sky lights; more reading room space; an
