Many Southwestern alumni have gone on to become U.S. governors, doctors, lawyers, military officers, ministers, actors as well as top Southwestern executives.

The program draws students from all over the country, and even some from British and French colleges. The students come for different reasons; boredom, lack of a challenge, and the need for money.

Amy Weidig, a junior who worked in Spokane, Washington, joined because she wanted "something challenging and exciting to do over the summer." A challenge is what most students get, as many work 13 hours a day, six days a week, sometimes dealing with hostile and unreasonable customers. Most feel it's worth it, though. Weidig felt that "it was a good experience for me. I brought back a lot of important skills and learned how to control my emotions when dealing with people. Basically, I learned how to be a professional."
