Next academic year, Guilford will be offering fewer single rooms than are used this year.

Presidential hosts will be getting roommates for the next year, and many students who petitioned for single rooms were turned down.

According to Provost Dan Poteet, "The residencehalls are designed to consist primarily of doubles. Collegerevenue estimates are based on that assumption. So this is a return to a practice that really should have been in effect over the years.

"The need for money" prompted the change in housing, Poteet said. "Revenue needs require that the college be less casual about this practice."

"It's philosophically important to the campus. It is intended to be a residential campus; it's not only a matter of money," Poteet said.
