Science building site proposed

The \$5.2 million proposed science building has a site selection, according to Art Kopschak, director of facilities and planning.

The Facilities Committee chose the site between Dana Auditorium and Worth House II last Friday.

"This site reinforces the mixing of functions across the campus [and provides] a prominent and attractive location."

"It does not commit the college to significant rearrangement of road and parking areas or require the renewal of buildings, nor does it preempt a broader academic facilities study currently underway."

The library was cleared within minutes and searched by adult staff members in conjunction with the Greensboro Police Dept. No evidence of any explosive device was found, and the library was reopened twenty minutes after the indicated time of detonation.

The forum at 7:30 p.m. in the Gallery is to let everyone know about format changes including switching to a periodical which will be held in a protective binding box.

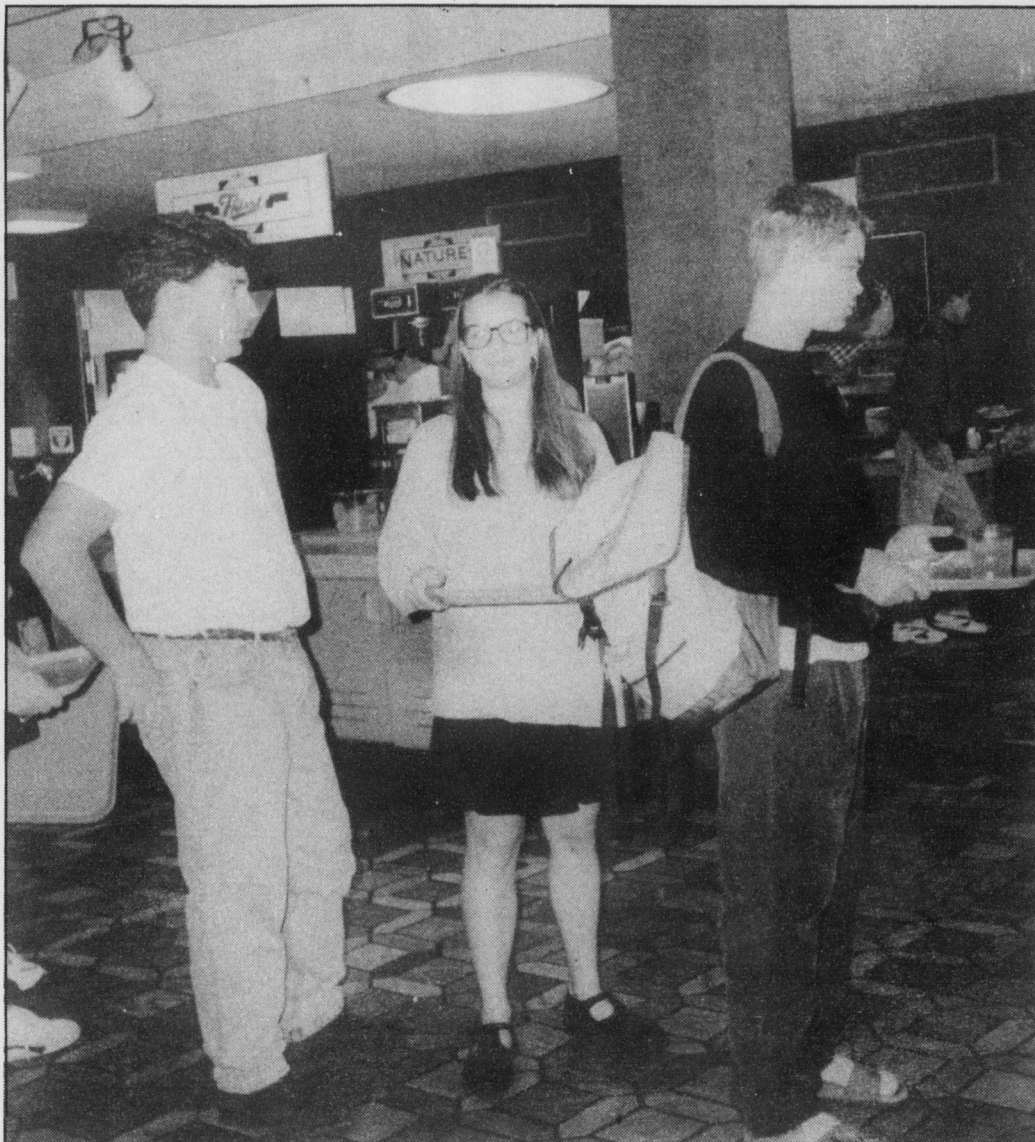

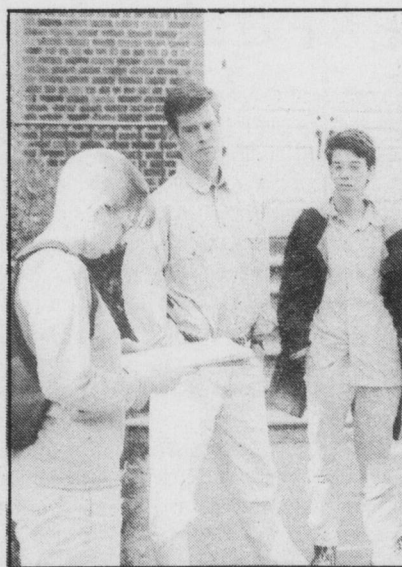
