ten o'clock radio show on WQFS, said, "I'm really happy that we won..... happy and exhausted.

"I think that we are the most qualified people for the job, but you have to give Wade and his ticket credit for running a very creative, intelligent and positive campaign."

Meanwhile, the members of the Tomlinson ticket disbanded after the evening's disappointments to spend some time in quiet reflection and contemplation.

Kasun has been accepted to spend a semester abroad in Guadalajara. Had she been elected, she would have remained on campus next semester, but she now plans to pursue the former

option.

Kasun said, "When I come back to Guilford I'm sure I will be involved on campus again."

"I've learned a lot from the process of running for election, and feel that we've helped in solidifying the leadership for next year by pushing them to think about what they stand for. I am interested in sharing some of our platform ideas with Rich and hope he will appropriate them."

Remmes plans to limit his involvement with Senate next year saying, "I feel like I've given the students a choice and I've given them my best ideas."

Remmes extended congratulations and expressed his confidence in the Ewell ticket: "I think that a very good ticket is in office. Senate should do very well next year."

Jaravaza is unsure of his plans

for the next year.

"I'll have to give it a bit of time." he said.

For now, though, Jaravaza plans to, "...settle back into my own rhythm and play some rugby."

Of the election results, Jaravaza said, "Basically, people voted for Rich and he deserves to be in there. They're all very capable people."

Tomlinson, who will consider working on Senate next year, extended thanks to the other members of his ticket and his supporters and cited his ticket's integrity as "our one glowing achievement."

Tomlinson said, "I believe we ran a very fair and honest campaign, one deserving of respect. I, along with my colleagues, wish all of Rich's ticket the very best in Senate next year. I hope we can cooperate to make for a better Senate."
