## Piper, Quaker editors chosen

After years of difficulty filling editorships for Guilford's three major student publications, the editors of *The Quaker*, *The Piper*, and *The Guilfordian* have all been chosen, each meeting the application deadline.

This year's *Quaker* yearbook editor is Senior Jodie Hargus. Hargus has had multi-faceted experience on the *Quaker*, as well as on other magazines, journals and newspapers, she said.

*The Piper* literary magazine will be headed by Christopher Huggins, current format editor and selections staffer for *The Piper*.

While Hargus plans to stay with

the format for the yearbook, Huggins said he intends to change the entire format of *The Piper*.

"The length of each publication is going to double," he said, and will include prose, short plays, stories, essays, and all forms of art. In addition, he plans to change much of the design. Huggins said that out of the normal 60 to 70 *Piper* submissions, he will accept around 40 and work with the writers. "I plan on dealing a lot more with the writers personally," he said.
