seemed to work out."

Bek was also glad that fewer people were turned away from the voting tables this year under the new rule clarifying the rules about acceptable identification. Previously, only Guilford College IDs were accepted, but this year government-issued ID was also accepted.

The Union race was initially uncontested but ended up being more of a race than expected. Junior Devra Thomas put together a write-in ticket last week, with Matthew Zuehlke as VP, Will Dodson as secretary, and Mae Kalwaic as

treasurer. The ticket did win 96 votes but was beaten by the Hahnel ticket's 318.

"Those are amazing results for a write-in," said Bek.
