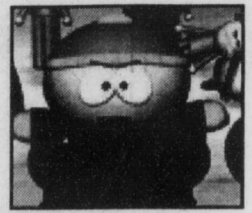

More Senate turnover

Following a trend of the last few years, Senate's leadership will be changing after the end of Fall semester.

Senate Vice President Luke Martin and Secretary Jill Reemsnnyder of Student Senate are both resigning their positions in order to participate in the study abroad program in Brunnenberg this spring. Although they expressed regret at not being able to finish out their terms, they are

looking forward to a wonderful experience next semester. There seem to be no hard feelings of any sort in their departure.

At the Senate meeting on Wednesday, the Academic Affairs Committee nominated senior Jenny Craigie for the position of vice-president.

This will be the second time that Craigie, four-year member of Senate and current Steering Committee member, will have served in an executive position—she served as secretary last year when the elected secretary went to CCE status—but she has yet to actually run for office.

"I think Jenny can do an absolutely wonderful job," said Academic Affairs Chair Andrea Dodson. Craigie and Dodson have served on the executive committee before and Dodson expressed a deep confidence in Craigie's experience and ability.

Senate president Shawan Gabriel wished the departing senators well, adding, "I hope they have a good semester and I hope we have a better one than this one was."

Herb Poole passes away

"For me, there were two things I always wanted to do other than lead a normal life and have a family: one was to learn how to play the bagpipes and the other was to learn how to fly an airplane."

So spoke Dr. Herbert Poole, former director of Guilford College's library, in 1985. He did both, among many other dizzying accomplishments that peppered a life rich in service.

Poole passed away from a self-inflicted gunshot wound on Wed, Nov. 17th. He leaves behind legacies both intangible and tangible in the hundreds of people whose lives he has influenced and at Guilford's Hege library, which grew into a model for small colleges under his leadership.

A native of North Carolina, Poole's career began in the U.S. army, where he served as a Russian interpreter in Germany during the 1950s. He joined the staff of Guilford's library in 1965,
