E. J. Heath Speaks On Reconstruction

Professor Edwin J. Heath, Secretary to the Administration of Salem Academy and College and head of the College History Department, was secured by the International Relations Club to deliver an address in Shearer Hall, Davidson College, on Thursday evening, October 9. The subject of his address was extremely fitting in view of the fact that the Czechs have occupied a prominent place in the (highlight of international affairs in recent years; and, especially since the Moravian Church, of which Professor Heath is a member and minister, originated in Czech-Slovakia in the early part of the fifteenth century.

The lecture, which was both interesting and informative, was attended by a number of college students and townspeople.
