**Student European Tour Is Planned**

A year and a half ago two American students conceived the idea of founding an organization which would make European travel more enjoyable as well as educational for students. This suggestion was carried out and the Bureau of American Student Travel was founded with its headquarters at number 44 Rue St. Lazare, Paris. Since then its name has been changed to the International Student Hospitality Association. This organization is composed of the Confederation Internationale des Etudiants, the International Student Service and the National Union of German Students, as European representatives, and the Open Road, Inc., as the American representatives.

The purpose of this organization is to help the American students find entrance into everyday European life. In order to do this the European organization undertook to interest European students in the welcome of American students. When the American student arrives in Europe, instead of prying his way into the life around him with money, he is received and entertained by students like himself.

The trans-Atlantic crossing is conducted by the Student Third Cabin Association and is made pleasant by a staff of hosts and hostesses who direct the entertainment.

Where there are academic dormitories or student hotels they are used for lodging. Often lodging is in private homes. If a hotel is used, it is generally a less pretentious one, patronized by the people of the country.

There are four types of tours planned. First, the Intensive Tour which is spent for the most part in one country and in getting beneath the surface of that country. Second, the Regional Tour which is an economic, geographic and historical tour. It demands a certain preparatory knowledge of Europe. Third, the Informal Tour, which is not very definite and is left to the spirit of the occasion and the human relations. Fourth, the Study tour, which is an opportunity for a whole class and a teacher to see and study that in which they are interested. All the tours include Paris and Geneva and the groups will be comprised of either men or women. Mixed parties are not considered.
