**Dr. Floyd's Doctorial
Thesis Now In French**

Dr. Floyd, head of the Romance Language Department, has just received a copy of the translation of her doctoral thesis *Women in the Life of Balzac*, from a Parisian publisher. This thesis is the second doctoral thesis ever to be translated into a foreign language, and this fact establishes Dr. Floyd's reputation as one of the outstanding critics of the great Balzac.

The English text was printed in 1921, and much praise was accorded Dr. Floyd at that time for the excellent work. Princess Radziwili, a friend of Dr. Floyd and also related to the family of Balzac, recognized at once the value of the book, and with the author's permission she translated it into French. The recent edition is entitled *Les Femmes dans la Vie de Balzac*, and its charm is increased by the addition of some letters written by Mme. Hanska who later was Mme. de Balzac. This is the first time the letters have been printed, and they bring to light additional material concerning one of the greatest love affairs in all France.

The French text is printed by one of the great publishers of Paris, *Librairie Plon*, and is most attractive in every respect.
