write as many three-letter words as could be devised from the letters in the long word. The average individual record for ten minutes was 92, while the average group record was 75. This seems to prove that group thinking is better than individual thinking.

Professor Aza Arthur Shaffer demonstrated the fact that blindfolded persons walk, swim and drive automobiles in spirals. Dr. Charles Haskell Danforth of Stanford University grafted a patch of skin from a White Leghorn to a Plymouth Rock chick, from which Leghorn feather grew, proving that skin is the determining factor in feather making.

Dr. Clinton Joseph Davison of the Bell Telephone Laboratories performed an important and also strange experiment, proving that electrons leave their parent body in radiating waves as well as in separate particles. Dr. Arthur Sherry Coggeshall, chief paleontologist at the Carnegie Museum, Pittsburgh, said in an interesting lecture on dinosaurs: "His brain was about the size of a man's thumb—in fact the telegraph system of his great body was so important that if somebody stepped on his tail his brain, 80 feet from the injured member, would never have received the message."

Many other interesting experiments, investigations and views on physics, medicine, genetics, evolution and other scientific subjects were presented by notable scientists.

The social side of the meeting included banquets, teas and different entertainments, a most interesting event being a trip to The Hermitage, Andrew Jackson's old home place. Dr. Arthur Amos Noyes of the California Institute of Technology presided over the meeting. Dr. Henry Fairfield Osborn, president of the American Museum of Natural History, was elected to preside over the meeting which will be held next year.
