News of the World

The German-Irish trans-Atlantic fliers who have been marooned for two days on Greenly Island in the straits of Belle Isle, off the southern coast of Labrador, have been rescued and brought safely to Canada. The three fliers, Captain Hermann Koehl, Colonel James Fitzmaurice and Fredrich Gunther von Herenfeld, were attempting to fly from Germany to America, but because of fog and a break in the lighting system of their airship the men flew four hundred miles off their course, finally effecting a landing on Greenly Island. By wireless they made their plight known in Canada, from which Duke Schiller, American air ace, brought a relief plane to the stranded birdmen and made arrangements for their removal to Canada.

On April 15, the dirigible Italia commanded by the Italian air hero, General Umberto Nobile, left Milan on the first leg of the long flight to the North Pole. This is General Nobile's second expedition to the North Pole, for in 1926 Nobile was with Amundsen and Lincoln Ellsworth when they flew over the Pole in the dirigible Norge. Nobile with a crew of scientists, officers, mechanics, sailors, and soldiers of the Alpine guards, left Italy amid cheers and music. The first stop of the dirigible will be at Stolp, Germany, en route to Spitzbergen. The cabin of the Italia has in its many lockers and good-luck charms given General Nobile by his friends. Nobile also has with him a six-foot cross presented by the Pope. This cross contains, in an aperture on the top, a parchment, hand-written by the Pope. Both the cross and parchment are to be dropped over the Pole.

Madame Ernestine Schumann-Heink famous opera singer, has just given her estate, Grossmont, near San Diego, Calif., to disabled veterans of the World War. Madame Schumann-Heink has given the two hundred and fifty thousand dollars who played taps for her sons who played taps for her two sons who

lost their lives in the war—one son fighting for the United States, the other for Germany.
