Viscount Willingdom, Governor-General of Canada is appointed Viceroy of India. He will succeed Lord Irwin, whose five-year term expires in April.

Belgium. Emil Vandervelde, former Belgian Emil Vandervette, former Bergan foreign minister, denounces his coun-try's alliance with France as useless. He fears lest Belgium be dragged into wars concerning the Polish or Italian Frontiers. Vandervelde him-self made the alliance in 1920.

Spain.

The Spanish Dictator, General Berengrer, in a newspaper interview, promises that before March I there will be a Spanish National election, a new constitution and the end of a new constr dictatorship.

At the request of the Unemploymen Committee, The Metropolitian Life Insurance Co, made a sample survey of unemployment among its industrial policy holders in forty-six of the larger cities. It indicates that between 4,500,000 and 3,000,000 persons in the United States were unemployed in the first week of December 1930. The count was restricted to industrial policy holders of the Insurance Company, representing the group which is believed to be most seriously affected by unemployment.
