preparatory school where they have arithmetic. Then, at about ten years
of age they enter the gymnasia which is made up of seven grades and prepares students to enter the university. From grades $1-3$ they have arithmetic, from 3-7 algebra, from 4-6 geometry, and in the seventh grade trigonometry. They have no textbooks but all the work in solving problems is original. They each year and are sometimes examined then on several years work During the year they have many oral quizzes. Their systern of grading is also different. Five is the highest rade, then four, three, and on down. Tree minus is passing and two is failure. They also have mathematics clubs, the activities of which are very similar to ours.
