hospitality. There must have been a different reason, and humanitarian Luke was well aware of this. The answer or reason is this: There had been no direct change in Jesus' simple, sweet and understanding attitude toward the routine of every day life. This same attitude is essential to Christianity. Christian life is not one of high, emotional planes and experiences. One reaches the high places only by the commonplace highway. Luke knew this fact and this story will never cease to be true with each one of us.

Up to the front porch of each of our homes, Jesus comes in this simple, unassuming manner and in the way we receive Him, we express our selves. There is always the struggle between criticisms, self-pity, confusion, and responsibility of daily life on one hand, and Jesus with simplicity and unaffectedness on the other, to whom one word or prayer can make one's attitude that of wondering, hoping and listening.

Every story reaches its writer through someone. Who told this story until it reached Luke's ear? Did Jesus go out and tell of this hasty rebuke? We know that he did not. Did Mary tell it; we think not. Nine times out of ten, by changing the personal pronoun, we can find who told the story, and in this case it was Martha.

If Martha told this, then the sequel to this story satisfies us completely, for Jesus' reply wrought in her heart what it can do in our own heart, and she had the courage to pass it on to the generations of the future.
