The Community Service group offers an opportunity of putting in to practice what was learned in the study group. Girls plan weekly meetings to entertain the ladies in the Salem Home. During the year various visits to the Children's Home are conducted by this group.

### Student and Industry

On regular occasions a group of Salem girls meets with a group of working girls to discuss various helpful and practical subjects. This phase of Social Service is conducted by the Student Industrial Committee.
