**DR. R. W. McDONALD ANNOUNCES HIS CANDIDACY FOR GENERAL ASSEMBLY**

Dr. R. W. McDonald, head of the Education Department at Salem College has announced his candidacy for the General Assembly. Knowing the seriousness of the severe set-backs which have come in the educational life of the state, and realizing that the real basis for civic, social, and economic advance of the state is enlightened citizenship, he is seeking election to the state's law making body on the merit of his work as an educator, and his active interest in civic life.

At the next session of the General Assembly it is believed he will be friendly towards education. Dr. McDonald is an informed, educational thinker, and should be of value in helping to solve the educational problems which arise.

Dr. McDonald has long been a close student of school taxation. He is believed that the basic reason for the present collapse of the school system over the country is the lack of an equitable tax basis for school support. He is interested in helping to work out North Carolina's taxing problems on the basis of the fundamental principle of ability to pay. "Because," says he, "only on the basis of such a tax plan can public education be maintained adequately."

Salem College students and faculty have expressed themselves as being happy over this definitely constructive step on the part of Dr. McDonald and have promised him their whole-hearted support and interest.
