Smith, Thursday afternoon from 4:00 to 5:30 o'clock. The course will include a study of masterpieces of Greek and Latin literature in translation. It will begin with the Greek epics and include a study of drama, lyric poetry, choral poetry, tragedy and oratory. Then a study of various types of Roman literature will follow. A comparison of the two will be made and their influence on other literature will be noted.

Miss Sallie B. Marks will give an education course: Investigations in Social Education. A survey will be made of the value of visual aids; effectiveness of graphs, charts, maps, motion pictures, etc.; the technique of visual aids for various classroom purposes. This class will be on Wednesdays from 4:00 to 5:30 o'clock.

A study of poetry by types will be offered by Dr. Pearl V. Willoughby on Wednesdays from 4:00 to 5:30 o'clock. Poetry of the nineteenth century will be studied mainly. Types to be studied include the ballad, the metaphorical romance, dramatic poetry, several types of lyric poetry, and metrical poetry. Keats, Whitman, and Lindsay will be considered as poets in modern poetry.

The Extension Office will be open from 3:00 to 6:00 each afternoon on February 13 and from 9:00 to 12:00 Saturday, February 6. For information concerning credit and fees call 2-3823.

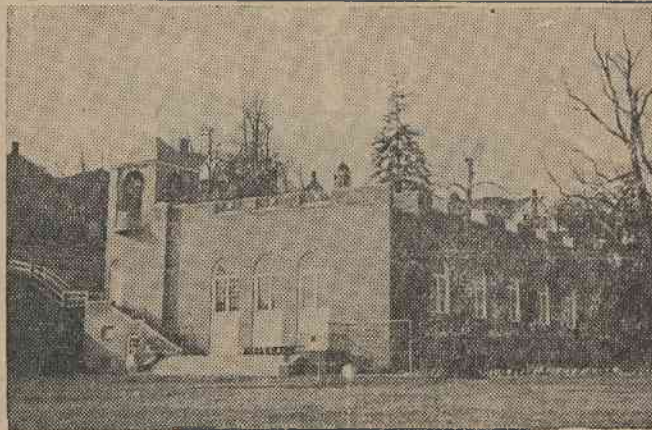
**LOUISVILLE CHILDREN

**To Be In Care of Miss Covington, Their Aunt**

Three children from Louisville, Kentucky, arrived in the city Saturday to be in the care of their aunt, Miss Evabelle Covington. They are David Covington Fowler, William Fowler and Caroline Covington Fowler.

Their home was given over as a shelter for flood victims, and their father and mother are both engaged in relief work. Their home is in that area comprising about one-fourth of the city, that is not inundated. Fifteen refugees were taken in by their parents.

The children were brought here by their older brother, who returned to aid in relief work. They will remain here until the flood waters have receded, and order is restored in Louisville.
