## NEW POINT SYSTEM IS INAUGURATED

There are to be two tournaments again this year, an "A" tournament and a "B" tournament, and a cup will be awarded to the winner of each. A new plan for awarding points to the two teams will be used this year: To members of the "A" team — four points; to a substitute on the "A" team — one or two points depending on service rendered; to members of the "B" team — 2 points; to a substitute on the "B" team — one point. But another rule reads: "Seniors and Juniors who do not attend 30 per cent of the called practices of a sport will not receive any points in that sport but may play on the team; Sophomores and Freshmen who do not attend 40 per cent of the called practices of a sport will not receive points in that sport but may play on the team."
