Salem celebrated Pan American Day when Mr. Agnew Bahnson spoke to the Spanish and International Relations Clubs on Wednesday night at seven o'clock in the basement of Biting.

Mr. Bahnson told the clubs of his trip through South America and the different things of interest that he encountered there. He also showed the club many interesting trinkets, and pocket books—that he brought back with him.

Pan American Day is commemorated each year on the fourteenth of April. This day has as its object to record the economic, political, and spiritual ties of the twenty one republics of the American Continent. Pan American Day is on the fourteenth of April because on this date of the year 1890 the first American conference met in Washington. In selecting that date another reason was also taken into consideration: the day falls on the time of the year in which the majority of the schools of the American Continent are open.

Pan American Day was commemorated for the first time in all the American Continent on the fourteenth of April 1931. After then the celebration of that day has been retaining each year greater solemnity and has been made more continental.
