today. In this "parable" of our time, the airplane represents our civilization which has stalled at its high point and is in imminent danger of falling to the ground. If we lose control of this power we may crash or drift away into eternity. Continuing this aeronautical metaphor, Mr. Holder drew a parallel between wing slots on airplanes which check the speed of a fall through space and the spirit of God in Jesus and the church which will save civilization from plunging headlong downward.

In the Thursday assembly, Mr. Holder spoke of the infinite power and terror of the atomic age. He defined physical power as only a local thing which may fail. He said that we must rely on some other source than physical power. We can appeal with confidence to God's power because it is spiritual, and God is universal, divine, and living. We may destroy the outward semblances of Christianity, but nothing can destroy the power of the spirit of God.

In addition to making these talks, Rev. Holder conducted early chapel, talked personally to the girls after the meetings, and gave them further spiritual assistance in individual conferences every day both at the college and at the academy.
