over a million men were rejected by the draft because of emotional unfitness. Many servicemen were released for the same reason.

One-third of all the people in the United States are ill for some reason or other. Many of these patients have emotional conflicts rather than physical ones. There are at present over 600,000 people

in our country's mental institutions. There would be more if facilities were available.

He further commented on the enormous number of alcoholics and near-alcoholics in the nation. The chief cause of alcoholism is the "unsolved problem back of the insatiable desire for drink".

He stated that it has been proved that the most frequent cause for divorce in one out of every five marriages is the emotional immaturity of one or both of the people involved.

Between eighty and ninety per cent of all accidents have an emo-

tional rather than a physical cause. Further statistical data indicates that there is one suicide every ten minutes. Fifty-two per cent of the people in the United States suffer from insomnia.

Rev. Peace stated that this situation of widespread emotional instability comes about when "we are enjoying the greatest material prosperity we have ever had. Can man survive the situation he has created?" The answer is, he stated, that some can and some can't.

He then went into the explanation of his capacity at Reynolds. (Continued on page four)

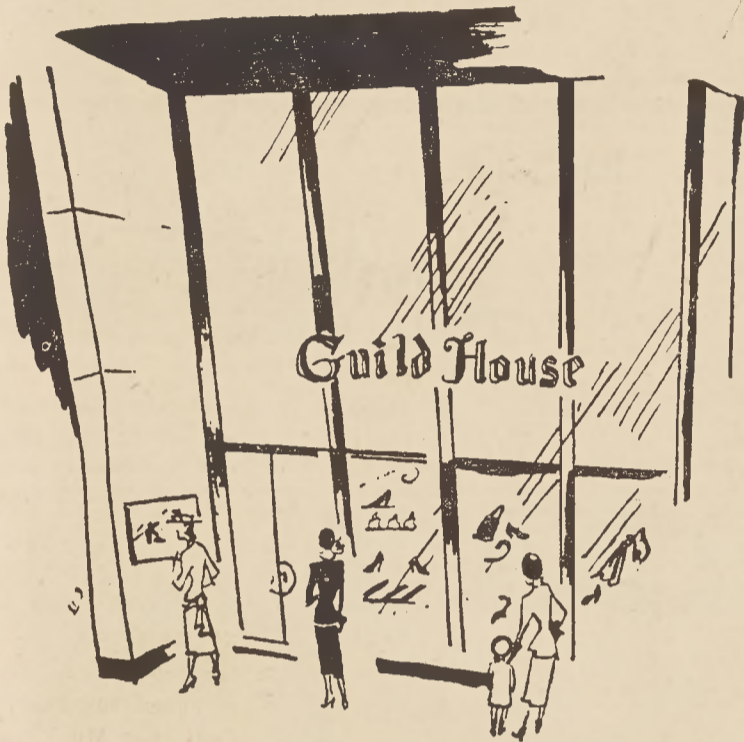

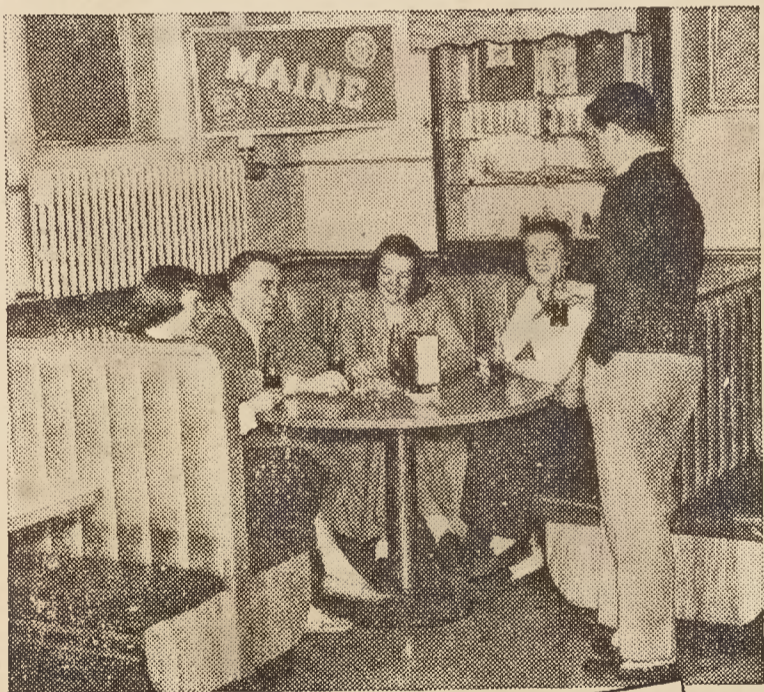
