Robinson. Mr. Robinson is noted for his collaboration with Joseph Campbell on a study of James Joyce's last and greatest work.

After five years of scholarly research their book, **A Skeleton Key to Finnegans Wake**, was presented to the public. He has written two successful novels: **The Perfect Round** and **The Great Snow**.

The Cardinal is a story of Stephen Fernoy, an American priest who becomes a prince of the Roman Catholic Church. It is a vivid, picturesque story carefully painted, beautifully detailed. Among its pages are laughter, tenderness, pity, suffering, love, both mortal and divine, good and evil, faith and heavenly understanding. Presented too are flocks of brilliantly portrayed characters, factual information on the complexity of Catholicism, human drama that moves, that vibrates, that surmounts pettiness, that adopts everlasting meaning. It is emotional, sensitive, strict, and sharp. It is a study of human beings and their relationship to Man, the Universe and God.

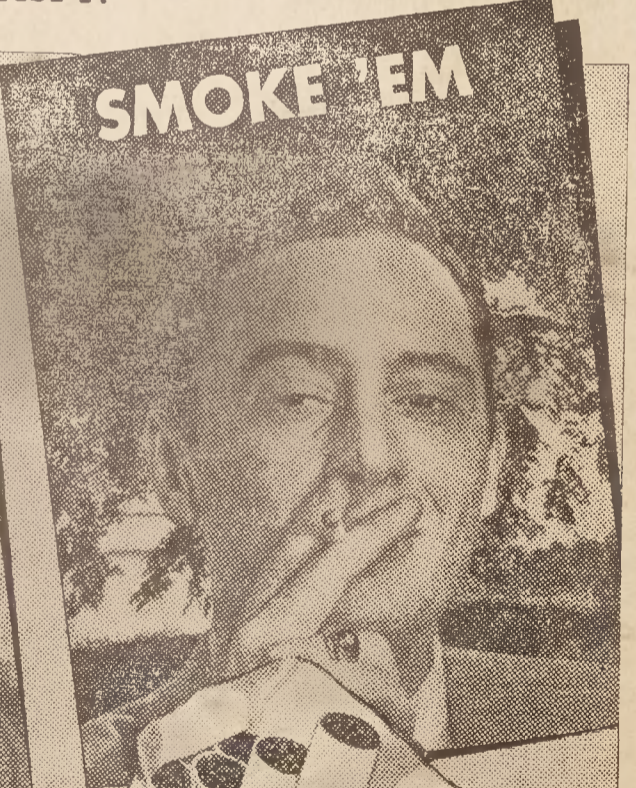
