

Patrice Munsel, Met Soprano, To Sing In Civic Music Series

Patrice Munsel, Metropolitan opera coloratura soprano, will present the second Civic Music Concert on Saturday, Nov. 3, at 8:30 p.m. at Reynolds Auditorium.

Miss Munsel is the youngest singer ever to have a Metropolitan contract. When only 18 years old she made her debut in the difficult role of Philine in "Mignon." At the conclusion of this performance she was rewarded with a seven minute ovation.

Since her debut, Miss Munsel has sung 11 leading roles at the Met, and this season she will have the lead in Mozart's "Cosi Tan

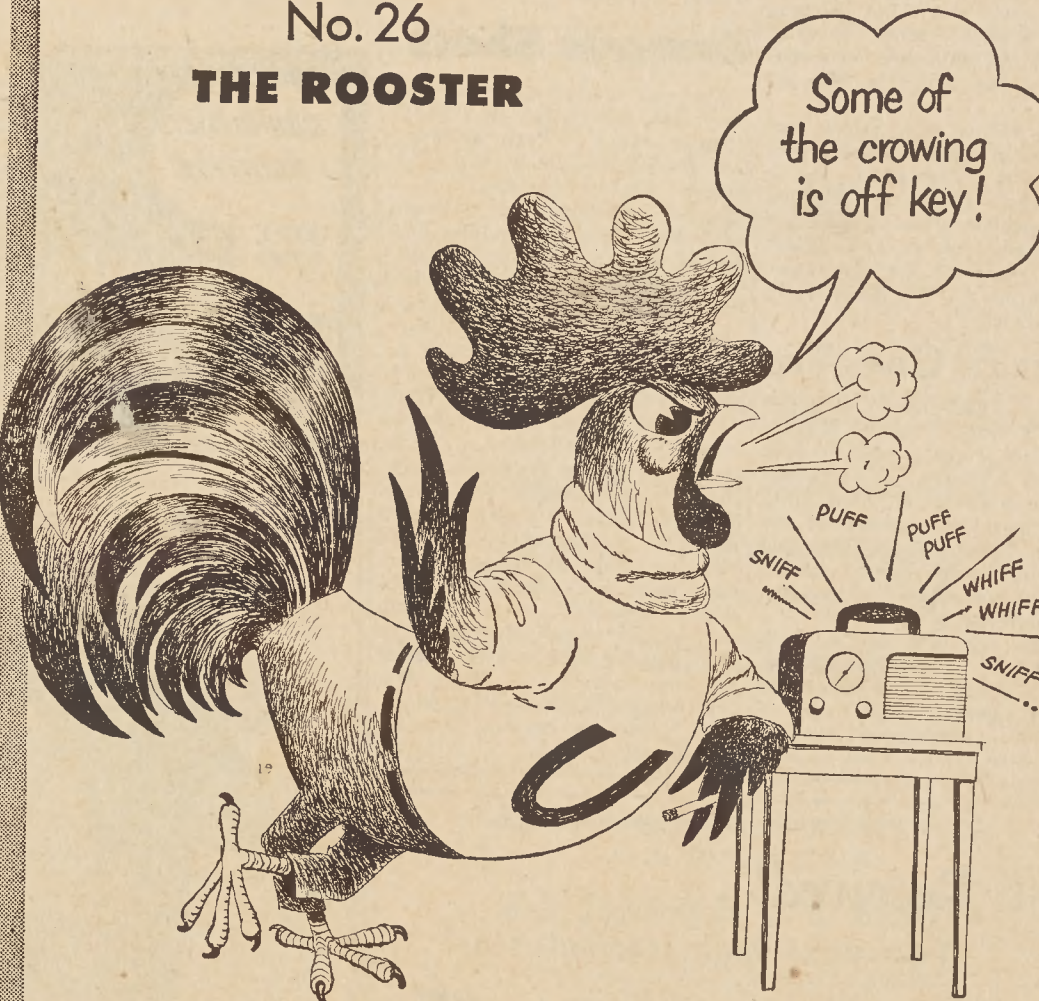
